



## **CLINICAL TRIAL COORDINATOR Research and Development (1 FTE)**

### **About the role.**

In this role you are primarily responsible for coordinating our clinical trials. It is a pivotal position where all laboratory and field studies for animals are coordinated across all ongoing research projects. VaxxinoVA has outsourced all laboratory and field studies for animals to external parties. The majority of these studies (70-80%) are poultry related.

Your main challenge is to obtain an overview of what is needed for each study, write detailed study plans, and then to bring all parties together in the right timeline, so that the research and development projects proceed without delay.
